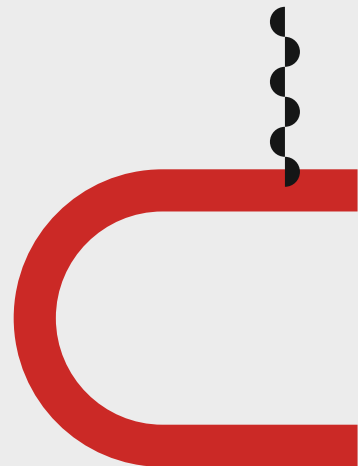
6th of June, 2021
